Key Discussion Items

Area	Discussion
Headline and Actions	DECISION: Headline report from July was approved (with no amendments) with no objections from MCAG members (<i>MCAG- DEC39 00:12:34</i>).
Service Design Update (Elexon Helix)	Helix provided updates regarding LDSO Onboarding and the engagements with pathways 2-6. Programme queried whether Helix was reporting on behalf of the DIP Manager. Helix confirmed the confusion was a typo that should have said ServiceNow Onboarding rather than DIP Onboarding. Programme asked whether all the activities are on track. Helix confirmed that they're all on track. The DNO Representative asked about LDSO onboarding and futures, and whether at least one contact is needed from every organisation. Programme confirmed this was correct and was the case on the 4th of August for Phase 1 and the same will be applied to Phase 2. The Operations Manual v2.0 and Low-Level Service Design v2.0 were published on 16 July 2025. Following feedback received, revisions have been made. Helix sought approval on both documents.

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Programme highlighted it should be an endorsement of the Operations Manual and the Low-Level Service Design, as they are not Programme deliverables and cannot approve them. Helix confirmed that they were looking for an endorsement. Programme asked whether there were any objections to MCAG endorsing Operations Manual v2.0 and Low-Level Service Design v2.0. There were no objections. The Chair, acting with delegated authority of the MHHS Senior Responsible Owner (SRO), approved/endorsed **DECISION**: MCAG endorsement of the Helix deliverables - Operations Manual (v2.0) and Low-level Service Design (v2.0) (MCAG-DEC40 - recording timestamp 00:14:13) Programme asked when v2.0 documents are to be published. Helix confirmed they've already been published and are the Go-Live versions. The Programme provided an M10 Readiness progress update, highlighting progress against each M10 Acceptance Criteria and the impact on M10 decisions. The Large Supplier representative queried whether there were any updates relating to the ELS 2.6 million ambition/volume of people going through testing. Programme confirmed that the Migration and Transition team are working collectively to articulate what the acceptable criterion looks like. Programme also confirmed the 2.6 million figure is based on the ELS model. **ACTION:** Programme to provide an update on the migration volumes that expect to be hit during each phase of ELS and to exit the ELS phase (MCAG16-01) Programme walked through M10/M11 Cutover Plan Elexon Reporting, which is updated weekly and presented at GLIG. Chair asked whether there were any open GLIG actions on the Cutover Reporting. Programme replied GLIG provides their view against M10 Readiness these activities and any concerns against the reporting. Programme confirmed the GLIG sessions provide a clear view of progress against the M10 Acceptance Criteria. The Programme then addressed M10 Decision making and choreography, focusing on governance, stakeholder engagement, and the coordination required for a smooth transition. The DNO Representative highlighted that, from an LDSO perspective, the critical Go/No Go decision date is 10 September, linked to the publication of ISD. By this point, all parties are expected to have implemented Release 9, with MPRS configured for the M10 milestone on 22 September. The DNO Representative noted that the final deadline for MPRS parameter changes is the early hours of 19 September, after which changes would be highly challenging given the system will be in live operation, and therefore queried whether a contingency plan is in place. The Programme confirmed that this issue will be considered at the M10 Contingency Planning Workshop on 27 August. The Large Supplier representative questioned whether there were any concerns raised about the D-flows, D43 and D82. Programme confirmed that there were no current concerns being flagged and encouraged the attendance of GLIG since that's where majority of updates

will be provided.

DCWG Updates	The Transition Team walked through Data Cleansing activities, reducing MPANs with invalid combinations to 6,944 and resolving key exceptions with Suppliers. They confirmed a Data Cleanse Closure Report is being prepared for early September, and preparations are underway with the DCC for the Domestic Premises Indicator population scheduled for 6–7 September.
	Programme asked the Transition team whether the MPAN Migration exclusion list means they can never be migrated. Transition team confirmed that without further corrective activity those on the exclusion list cannot yet be migrated. But there are some MPANs which require activities that will need to be completed by suppliers before they can migrate that MPAN.
MWG Updates	Programme went through the Migration readiness summary which outlines each milestone and its respective progress update. Programme confirmed that programme is on track to meet Dress Rehearsal criteria. Several milestones, including Dress Rehearsal 2 (DR2) and the Tier 2 MCC mobilisation, have shifted to amber, but mandatory functionality deployment remained on track for the original 29th August DR2 exit criteria; to give industry extra time to test additional migration-reporting dashboards beyond the formal criteria, DR2 is being extended by one week to 5th September, keeping both milestones amber until then. Despite the extension, the critical path not impacted. Sprint 0 Migration planning still proceeds as scheduled, with the schedule published on 16 September, planning starting on 24 September, and execution kicking off on 22 October.
Programme Milestones Related to MCAG	Programme provided an update on Programme Milestones Related to MCAG. Programme confirmed that despite being red, both milestones about M16 Methodology and Pre-migration Data Cleanse are on track and it's the baseline date which is to be amended, to reflect the true progress of the milestones.
Top Programme Risks Related to MCAG	Programme provided an update on risks Related to MCAG.
	Programme provided a summary of actions and decisions; no comments or questions were raised.
Summary and Next Steps	Chair flagged that an agent had enquired via email about gaining more detailed knowledge on agents getting insight into the migration plans and volumes from suppliers.
